Bradley Elliott Wiseman was born on December 23, 1984, at Hermann Hospital in Houston, Texas. He was the second child of the union of El'Ray Wiseman, Jr and Faren Sims Wiseman of Houston, Texas.

Bradley expressed faith in God at an early age. He attended church regularly with his grandmother Mary Helen Wiseman. He united with St. Luke Baptist Church where he was an active member of the youth department.

Bradley was a good student who expressed an interest in art. His first grade teacher, Mrs. Freddye Watson, smiled as she told how Bradley would walk up to her with such pride as he presented to her his drawings to display in her classroom.



Bradley attended Booker T. Washington High School where he was a member of the band, playing the alto saxophone. He graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in 2002.
